Philosophy

St. Francis Preschool

is committed to providing a Christ-centered preschool readiness-learning environment that encourages the development of the whole child through creative play. Educational research indicates that the early years are the most crucial for learning and that the environment of these years permanently affects the child's total personality, therefore, any effective educational program begins with the very young child in the family, and then, school. Our program strives to promote a creative and non-competitive learning environment that encourages the interaction with other children and adults in an atmosphere of love and concern.



Curriculum

Through play and learning experiences, our program encourages growth in spiritual, physical, intellectual, social and emotional development. A child's sense of God comes from the warm atmosphere of love and acceptance in the preschool environment where the child learns about God's wonderful world.

Reading Readiness

Reading Readiness is an integral part of our Catholic preschool program. Pre-reading skills are introduced through read aloud, circle time, centers, and music.

Language

Language is the development of communication skills (listening, speaking, and thinking) that enables a child to share his/her world with others.

Math Readiness

Math Readiness at the preschool level involves acquiring knowledge and developing skills through play and manipulatives.

Fine Motor

Fine Motor eye-hand coordination is developed through coloring, cutting, writing, pouring and painting, etc.

Gross Motor

Gross Motor body coordination is developed through large muscle activity (marching, running, jumping, throwing a ball, movement activities, etc.)

Personal-Social Development

Personal-Social Development is a primary goal for a young child entering preschool. It involves an environment where a child establishes autonomy and learns skills to help relate to his/her world.

Art

Art at the preschool level is a joyful, creative experience full of self-expression. Creative art activities come from the use of manipulatives that develop fine motor skills.

Play

Play is a child's business. The value of free play cannot be overstated. Opportunities for play occur throughout the day and are incorporated into all of our learning activities.
